"Eighteen distinct gains" were claimed by the  
U.A.W.-C.I.O. in new contract...

Writes W.P. Brown, president of the company,  
The employees "have accepted a contractual ob-  
ligation to be members in good standing during  
the life of the agreement we have just com-  
pleted," Brown wrote.

"Therefore they should pay their dues promptly  
and take an active part in the affairs of the  
union so that proper and responsible repre-  
sentation may be assured."
