Action Plan



Strategic activities: UI Working Group

- prepare a strategy for UI
 - priorities & priority target groups
- design an evaluation framework for UI activities
 - recording & measurement of activities
 - collecting feedback from the participants
 - evaluation of UI activities
 - monitoring & evaluation of uptake
- establish a model for co-operation between CLARIN ERIC and national consortia
 - minimum standards
 - share experience & know-how
- define the role of CLARIN ambassadors

Strategic activities: Involvement in curricula

- compile a list of relevant university curricula
 - Course Registry
- establish connections to add CLARIN services, tools and resources to the curricula

Strategic activities: COST Actions

- compile a list of relevant COST Actions
- establish connections and seek involvement
 - networking meetings, scientific workshops & conferences
 - training schools
 - short-term scientific mission

Field activities: Master Classes

- a session at a major DH or SS event
- CLARIN experts answer researchers' questions and recommend CLARIN approaches, tools, resources

Field activities: Summer School Courses

- compile a list of most relevant summer schools in CL, DH and SS
- seek agreement with summer school organizers to accept CLARIN co-located events, e.g. tutorials, courses, workshops
- actively encourage researchers from the CLARIN community to hold courses, tutorials or workshops at the summer schools through an open call

Field activities: Training Events

- offer co-financing of UI training events of the national consortia through an open call
- workshops and seminars on new and key language tools and resources
 - for DH and SS lecturers and researchers at universities, institutes, libraries, archives and museums
- teacher seminars addressing deficitary topics
 - providing teacher training and teaching materials
- targeted seminars addressing under-serviced communities
 - e.g. diaspora, minorities, special needs
- refreshment courses for language professionals
 - e.g. translators, language editors, journalists

Supporting activities

- Website
 - improve visibility of UI on the web page
 - update UI internal page
- Tour de CLARIN
 - periodic highlights UI activities of a different national consortium
 - if possible, add showcases from that country
- Videolectures
 - add visibility of CLARIN talks and tutorials
- User Surveys
 - select 2 priority user groups, 1 in DH, 1 in SS
 - find out what resources, tools, training and support these users need
 - co-locate with CLARIN PLUS workshops or other UI events
- Seek collaboration opportunities with other ERICs
 - SHARE, ESS, CESSDA, DARIAH

CLARIN ERIC


- CLARIN PLUS workshops
 - demonstrate the application of CLARIN tools & services to advance DH & SS research in fields other than linguistics
 - target a specific user group & present a carefully selected set of attested applications of language & speech technology in DH & SS
 - 40 participants, 2 days, invited talks, presentations by participants, discussion groups, presentations recorded & published on-line
 - Exploring Spoken Word Data in Oral History Archives
 18-19 April 2016, Oxford (UK)
 - Working with Digital Collections of Newspapers
 19-21 September 2016, Leuven (Belgium)
 - Parliamentary dataSofia (Bulgaria)
 - Social media data
 Kaunas (Lithuania)
- PARTHENOS user requirements report
 - coordination of a 300-page <u>User Requirements Report</u> (in the humanities, wrt. infrastructures & technology)

National consortia

- increasing maturity of the existing consortia & rising number of new consortia
- number & range of activities has increased significantly
 - the same number of activities in a single year (2016) as in the period of 2012-2015
 - the Finnish consortium reported the highest number of activities (22)
 - additional 5 consortia carried out over 10 events in 2016: Sweden, Austria, Germany,
 the Netherlands & Poland
 - most activities were 1-day events (64%) & were attended by 7-150 participants

Type of activity

- 9 different broad categories of event types identified:
 - publication/presentation of a conference/journal poster/paper
 - teaching of a course/lecture/tutorial
 - organization of a workshop
 - organization of a conference
 - curation projects
 - dissemination activities in public media/on the web
 - technical improvements of the repositories, services, tools, resources
 - collaboration with other initiatives, countries, helpdesk activities
- most frequent activity: active participation with presentations, demonstration booths & papers at a conference/workshop/journal (25%)
- most frequent discipline: language & linguistics (74%)
- the granularity of reporting varies from one consortium to the other

Summary

- an impressive breadth to CLARIN's range of involvements
- a certain unevenness across the various national consortia, mostly due to different levels of maturity & budget available
 - understandable that more mature & better funded consortia will continue to offer more UI activities
 - BUT we will try to ensure the minimum standards of user engagement across the network
 - we will strive to further standardise the activity-reporting procedure to obtain more comprehensive records & achieve a more even granularity of the events reported by different consortia
